## The Artist

Dale Chihuly's achievements in the medium of glass are well known to an international audience. From the inception of his career, Chihuly was involved in the American studio glass movement, establishing the glass program at Rhode Island School of Design in 1969, and co-founding the seminal Pilchuck Glass School in 1971. In 1995, working in glass factories in Finland, Ireland and Mexico, Chihuly embarked on "Chihuly over Venice," which culminated with the installation of sculptures over the canals and piazze of Venice, Italy. Four years later he presented his most ambitious installation to date with "Chihuly in the Light of Jerusalem." More than one million visitors attended the Tower of David Museum to view his installations. Chihuly has more recently created "Chihuly in the Park: A Garden of Glass" at Chicago's Garfield Park Conservatory (2001–2002), the "Chihuly Bridge of Glass" in Tacoma (2002), "Mille Fiori" at the Tacoma Art Museum (2003) and "Chihuly in the Garden" at the Atlanta Botanical Gardens (2004, ongoing). Future projects include a major installation at Kew Gardens, London.

CHIHULY: LOS ANGELES marks the first time the City will experience a large-scale presentation of the artist's work. Over the past four decades, Dale Chihuly has established himself as one of the world's most dynamic and inventive contemporary artists. He has transformed the medium of glass into a major art form, producing dramatic works that range in scope from intimate vessels to monumental public sculpture.
